Since those first sessions, the school has been in continuous operation at its present location, offering first class education for all including Grade 9 through Grade 12 subjects.

All courses currently offered at FutureSkills are for recognized credits.

The on-going focus of the school has always been on Academic Achievement.

Most students enroll for courses to advance their education towards their high school graduation. This generally entails adding to their total credits. However, FutureSkills also enables students to enroll in courses that they previously took in the public system but in which they were not satisfied with the marks that they were given. Through these courses, their goal is to improve specific marks.

Student learning is based on the four key elements of a strong Academic background as defined by the Ontario Ministry of Educa-

tion. These are:

Knowledge of subject – which constitutes the material they must absorb for each course that they take

Critical Thinking Skills– which enable students to bring to bear their own understanding of course content

Communication Skills – which enable students to both share their ideas with others and understand the ideas of others.

Grammar Skills – enabling students to properly use the basic structure of the English language

Student achievement is measured in accordance with the Ministry Guideline titled “Growing Success”. This Guideline enables FutureSkills teachers to provide students with the education that the Ministry expects all students – both in the public and the private sectors in Ontario to achieve.

TEACHING METHODS

FutureSkills offers its courses to both International and Canadian Students, in both classroom and online formats. Students can





chose to pursue either a University or a College focused program.

For students who decide to change from one program to the other, we offer required prerequisite courses.

For students needing personal assistance with specific subjects, our teachers are available for one-on-one tutoring
